

Topic: Key Elements of Problem Statement – Dissertation Writing Guide

The problem statement is the most significant element of [writing service](#). The statement of the problem is the claim which the writer made in the research work. It generally highlights the problem which will be addressed by the research or study. The research questions get addressed by the problem statement. The problem statement aims at transforming the generalized problem into a narrow and specific problem that can be defined. Key Points

From the definition of the problem statement, the key points of it are clear. These key points are as follows:

- Context: problem statement establishes the context for the readers and audiences.
- Problem: The problem statement defines the problem within the established context.
- Solution: Problem statement provides a solution to the raised problem [writing assignments](#)

Status Quo

Status quo is used for things generally the way they are. People must be persuaded to examine their status quo to influence their minds and actions. The common ground develops between the

Destabilizing Moment

- Generally destabilizing moment
- Represents the question to be answered
- Urges people to change their thought or action
- Establishes cost and benefit analysis
- Elaborates a need

Questions

The important element of the problem statement is to raise a question in it. By anticipating the question, you provide the audience opportunity to indulge in the early discussion. Consequences

You present the readers with the benefits, consequences, and costs. The reader now must recognize their priorities and concerns based on those benefits, costs, and consequences which the writer has presented. Readers will recognize the persuasive consequences. These are such effects that will either cause benefit for readers or will make them suffer.

Solution

You introduce a claim in the form of the problem statement, your response to this problem is termed as a solution. It can be in the form of resolution or a proper proposed resolution of the problem. If you have referred to the cost in terms of consequences then the benefits will represent the solution of the proposed problem. You will answer the question that how a certain solution will be presented to eliminate the problem [custom writing](#)

Think:

While crafting a problem statement you will have to look and think the following things:

- With what elements audiences should be presented so that they can appreciate the solution you provided.
- What are the factors which made the solution easy or difficult for the audiences to accept?
- What are the advantages and drawbacks of the solutions you provided?

A good problem statement should have the following characteristics:

- It should advocate the gap in the literature.
- It should contribute to the existing literature.
- It should create opportunities for further research.
- It should use an ethical approach to solve the problem.
- It should be interesting for the other researchers as well.
- It must be suitable for the skills, time, and resources.
